UNDERstanding Frontotemporal Dementia (FTD) and Primary Progressive Aphasias (PPA)

In frontotemporal dementias there can be a greater burden of problems in personality and behavior. FTD diseases can cause people to become more disinhibited, have reduced empathy, or not follow social norms. PPA can cause changes that are restricted to speech and language with preservation of memory and other functions.

We will discuss the symptoms most commonly seen in these conditions, the underlying causes, how these differ from Alzheimer's disease, and how these conditions can be best treated and supported.
